**Description of the possible adverse effects of the pesticides as per the Material Safety Data Sheets for the pesticides to be used, if available:**

     May cause skin irritation, may cause eye irritation. Prolonged or frequently repeated contact with skin may cause allergic reactions in some people. Harmful if swallowed. Wash hands after use.

**REMEMBER: Whenever a non-low impact pesticide is used on school property there is also a Restricted Entry Interval (REI) that begins when the pesticide application ends. This Restricted Entry Interval last for seven hours unless the product label**

uses **NUMERIC LANGUAGE**, e.g., 4hours or 12 hours; directing a longer or shorter period of time. If the product label does not discuss Restricted Entry the period of time defaults to seven (7) hours.
